Exciting News from St Arilda's Church!



Thornbury and District League of Friends exists to support community health and wellbeing within Thornbury and the surrounding villages.

Since the closure of Thornbury Hospital at the end of2018 we have continued to support the Henderson Rehabilitation Unit at Grace Care Centre and the Outpatients in St Mary Centre, however our main focus is now as a grant-giving body whereby we accept applications (on an annual basis) from any local organisation or charity which requires funding for a specific health/wellbeing-related project. All such applications are carefully considered each November.

<u>Carbon Awareness Training Course</u> - 27th April, 9.30-3pm at St Paul's Church.

Join Cate Williams and Julie Nelson for a day of Carbon Awareness Training. Carbon Awareness is a short 4 hour course, enabling participants to explore questions around engaging with climate change in church life.

It covers four key questions:

Why does reducing our use of fossil fuels matter so much? What changes can we make that make the most difference? How we can encourage others to get involved? How does this fit into the whole of church life?

Participants will leave the course better equipped to make positive changes in their own household as well as feeling more confident to engage both with church, and others to encourage more people to take this seriously.

As a short 4 hour course, Carbon Awareness can either be delivered as a whole or split into two or more sessions.

CHURCH RE-ORDERING

We are pleased to say that we have now received the Faculty (permission) for the reordering works to the west end of St Mary's Church. The work will start immediately after Easter, and will take at least 6 months to complete.

In case you are not aware, the work will involve the whole of the back area of the Church, in other words the raised carpeted area, being closed off. The carpeted floor is being replaced with stone paving at the same level as the body of the Church. There will be a large, dedicated storage area in the corner where the kitchen is now, and a new, much larger, servery will be built in the north-west corner which is currently the children's area. There will still be a children's area, but it will be in a more central position in the back of the Church, with purpose-built cupboards.

The font will be moved eastwards so that it aligns with the south and north doors. In the west end vestry, the current toilet will be replaced with a fully compliant disabled toilet and a second toilet constructed. The existing choir robes and books storage will also be replaced with a purpose built storage unit.

Whilst the works are ongoing, there will be a temporary fully accessible toilet unit outside. This will not be a chemical toilet, but a fully plumbed in disabled toilet unit. Unfortunately, whilst the works are ongoing, we will not be able to have our usual

refreshments and social time after services. However, this might well be a time when you could consider inviting a few people home for a chat and a cup of tea / coffee after the service. Please do speak to any of the Church wardens if you have any questions or concerns about any of the above.

GOSPEL READING

John 12, 20-26a

20 Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. 21 They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' 22 Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. 23 Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. 24 Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain;

but if it dies, it bears much fruit. 25 Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. 26 Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also.

FOR OUR ENVIRONMENT - Our rivers are dying – and factory chicken farming is fuelling the crisis. Millions of birds are crammed into industrial units near our rivers producing huge volumes of polluting chicken manure. Spread as fertiliser on nearby fields, the phosphate in the manure can leech into rivers, causing algal blooms which starve the river of oxygen, killing precious habitats for wildlife like otters and kingfishers. The situation is dire: the Environment Agency reports 'unacceptable levels' of phosphate in over half of English rivers.

The Soil Association are asking the UK Governments for:
A ban on new intensive poultry units
Support farmers to exit this damaging industry
Action to reduce chicken consumption to more sustainable levels

FOR OUR WORLD – We pray for the safe return of the hundreds of school children taken in Nigeria. Nigerian security forces continued to search forests and set up roadblocks in the north-west of the country. Observers said combing the woodland expanses could take weeks.

More than 280 children aged between seven and 18 were <u>taken from a school in Kuriga</u> on Thursday in one of the biggest mass-abductions in recent months in Nigeria's turbulent north-west. A further 15 children were taken in <u>another raid on a school in Sokoto</u> on Saturday.
