Since the closure of Thornbury Hospital at the end of 2018 we have continued to support the Henderson Rehabilitation Unit at Grace Care Centre and the Outpatients in St Mary Centre, however our main focus is now as a grant-giving body whereby we accept applications (on an annual basis) from any local organisation or charity which requires funding for a specific health/wellbeing-related project. CHURCH RE-ORDERING







With work starting soon after Easter, we are really excited to see our outdoor toilet and storage in place today. Environment champions are pleased to see our wild flowers being kept safe and there are no chemicals in the toilet!

We will continue to keep you updated as work continues at St Mary's. For more updates please do follow the Thornbury Benefice Facebook page.

We are pleased to say that we have now received the Faculty (permission) for the reordering works to the west end of St Mary's Church. The work will start after Easter, and will take at least 6 months to complete.

The work will involve the whole of the back area of the Church, in other words the raised carpeted area, being closed off. The carpeted floor is being replaced with stone paving at the same level as the body of the Church. There will be a large, dedicated storage area in the corner where the kitchen is now, and a new, larger servery will be built in the north-west corner. There will still be a children's area in a more central position in the back of the Church, with purpose-built cupboards.

The font will be moved eastwards so that it aligns with the south and north doors.

The current toilet will be replaced with a fully compliant disabled toilet and a second toilet constructed. The existing choir robes and books storage will also be replaced with a purpose built storage unit.

Mark 14. 3-9

3 While he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at the table, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment of nard, and she broke open the jar and poured the ointment on his head. 4 But some were there who said to one another in anger, 'Why was the ointment wasted in this way? 5 For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii, and the money given to the poor.' And they scolded her. 6 But Jesus said, 'Let her alone; why do you trouble her? She has performed a good service for me. 7 For you always have the poor with you, and you can show kindness to them whenever you wish; but you will not always have me. 8 She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for its burial. 9 Truly I tell you, wherever the good news is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in remembrance of her.'

FOR OUR ENVIRONMENT - In the Colombia-Ecuador border area, mangroves are threatened by pollution, the climate emergency and violence related to drug trafficking. According to estimates, 10 percent of mangroves have disappeared in the last 10 years at global level. In this particular area, the loss is estimated at 6 percent, corresponding to almost 145,000 hectares. The Amazon foothills have been home to Afro-descendant communities and the Awá Indigenous people. Communities on both sides of the border have contributed to the reforestation of over 10,000 hectares of land. This includes 400 hectares of mangroves on the Ecuadorian side and 9,600 hectares of tropical forest in Colombia. The Awá people preserve their rich agricultural heritage. Rescuing traditional seeds believed to be extinct in the area contributes to safeguarding the biodiversity of indigenous crops and reviving local farming practices.
