CHURCH RE-ORDERING

We are pleased to say that we have now received the Faculty (permission) for the reordering works to the west end of St Mary's Church. The work will start immediately after Easter, and will take at least 6 months to complete.

In case you are not aware, the work will involve the whole of the back area of the Church, in other words the raised carpeted area, being closed off. The carpeted floor is being replaced with stone paving at the same level as the body of the Church. There will be a large, dedicated storage area in the corner where the kitchen is now, and a new, much larger, servery will be built in the north-west corner which is currently the children's area. There will still be a children's area, but it will be in a more central position in the back of the Church, with purpose-built cupboards.

The font will be moved eastwards so that it aligns with the south and north doors. In the west end vestry, the current toilet will be replaced with a fully compliant disabled toilet and a second toilet constructed. The existing choir robes and books storage will also be replaced with a purpose built storage unit.

Whilst the works are ongoing, there will be a temporary fully accessible toilet unit outside. This will not be a chemical toilet, but a fully plumbed in disabled toilet unit.

Unfortunately, whilst the works are ongoing, we will not be able to have our usual refreshments and social time after services. However, this might well be a time when you could consider inviting a few people home for a chat and a cup of tea / coffee after the service. Please do speak to any of the Church wardens if you have any questions or concerns about any of the above.

Readings: Isaiah 25. 6-9, Acts 10. 34-43, Mark 16. 1-8

GOSPEL READING

Mark 16. 1-8

16 The day after the Sabbath day, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought some sweet-smelling spices to put on Jesus' body. 2 Very early on that day, the first day of the week, the women were on their way to the tomb. It was soon after sunrise. 3 They said to each other, "There is a large stone covering the entrance of the tomb. Who will move the stone for us?"

4 Then the women looked and saw that the stone was already moved. The stone was very large, but it was moved away from the entrance. 5 The women entered the tomb and saw a young man wearing a white robe. He was sitting on the right side, and the women were afraid.

6 But the man said, "Don't be afraid. You are looking for Jesus from Nazareth, the one who was killed on a cross. He has risen from death. He is not here. Look, here is the place they laid him. 7 Now go and tell his followers and Peter, 'Jesus is going into Galilee. He will be there before you. You will see him there as he told you before.'"

8 The women were confused and shaking with fear. They left the tomb and ran away. They did not tell anyone about what happened, because they were afraid.

FOR OUR ENVIRONMENT - How polluted are our rivers? The Guardian reported that raw sewage discharges had increased by 105% in 2023. Following on from this article The Guardian has analysed data released from the Environment Agency and has created maps for you to see how many spillages have occurred in specific areas across the UK. One river in the south of England features in the worst 10 rivers identified by the Guardian — the River Avon, as it makes its way through Bath and Bristol. The river suffered 6,573 sewage spills in 2023, or 74 spills per mile, making it the third most polluted in England!

FOR OUR WORLD – Since the beginning of the Israel-Gaza crisis, the number of people facing catastrophic hunger in Gaza has doubled, reaching 1.1 million – the highest number ever recorded. Children are already dying of hunger-related diseases, and malnutrition is spreading rapidly. In the North Gaza governorate alone, one in three children below the age of two is acutely malnourished, putting their lives at risk. The UN World Food Programme (WFP), are dedicated to saving lives and ending hunger. They are on the ground in Gaza, working every day to provide food to families. Access to the north is difficult, but their teams persevere: just last week, they delivered 18 truckloads of food supplies to Gaza City using a new coordinated route along the border to transport wheat flour, food parcels and ready-to-eat rations.
