Independent Safeguarding Audit - Gloucester Diocese is working with an independent Safeguarding Group conducting an audit across the Church of England to assess the extent to which the church is doing all it can to create an environment in which all can feel safe, valued and respected. Candles, torches, batteries. Water treatment tablets, mould treatment, plastic water containers. Walking boots.

GOSPEL READING:

Matthew 25:14-30

'For it is as if a man, going on a journey, summoned his slaves and entrusted his property to them; to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. The one who had received the five talents went off at once and traded with them, and made five more talents. In the same way, the one who had the two talents made two more talents. But the one who had received the one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. After a long time the master of those slaves came and settled accounts with them. Then the one who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five more talents, saying, "Master, you handed over to me five talents; see, I have made five more talents." His master said to him, "Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master." And the one with the two talents also came forward, saying, "Master, you handed over to me two talents; see, I have made two more talents." His master said to him, "Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master." Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, "Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours." But his master replied, "You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

FOR THE ENVIRONMENT – Climate change is threatening every part of our natural world. The landscape is being destroyed. Plants and wildlife are disappearing at an alarming rate. Our very survival on Earth is at risk. But if we look just below the surface, we'll find a powerful solution: **soil.**

Healthy soil not only gives us 95% of our food, it stores billions of tonnes of carbon – 10 billion tonnes in the UK's soils alone! – helping to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions. Plus it absorbs vast amounts of water, helping to defend us against flooding and drought. Yet every day in the UK, we lose the equivalent of 30 football pitches of soil, mainly because of intensive farming. By working with farmers to foster nature-friendly methods that protect our soil and everything that lives in it. For example, by planting more trees on farms we can produce healthier soil, boost wildlife and tackle climate change.

FOR OUR WORLD –With hundreds of earthquakes being recorded each day in Iceland's Reykjanes Peninsula. The fishing town of Grindavik has been evacuated, asking more than 3,000 residents to leave their homes and businesses. Authorities identified an underground river of magma under the town. There is a long history of volcanic activity in Iceland, with fewer than 400,00 people and 130 volcanoes, most of which are active. We pray for the people of Iceland and the scientists and government working hard to keep people safe.

FOR OUR COMMUNITY – **South Glos Council has launched a consultation on waste and recycling**. SGC is proposing some changes to its recycling and waste collection services and is seeking your views on this. The consultation closes on 7 January.
