<u>Church Action Plan</u> – The latest part of the Church Action plan will be coming out in November which will incorporate the Eco Church initiative.

New welcome flag – If you are hosting any outside activity for the church and would like a flag to grab people's attention, the church has invested in a welcome flag for all to borrow. It is easy to assemble, you will need a soft surface to push the flag into. Please contact the office and we can reserve it for you.

Church Library Box - We are starting a book borrowing scheme in both St Paul's and St Mary's. It's a form of library of "good reads". Many folk have inspirational books which they have enjoyed reading and might be willing to share with others. Each book will have a 'library card'. The owner can fill in the title, author and recommendation and this will be in the book. The borrower will complete their name and the date of borrowing and leave the card in the box. Books will thus be trackable and the owner will know where their book is and reclaim it if required. The library box will be in the Stafford Chapel in St Mary's and on a windowsill in St Pauls room.

<u>Water Guardians</u> - Thornbury Orchard Group is working with Wessex Water and Bristol Avon Rivers Trust (BART) to get the Water Guardians programme launched in our area. Our Eco Church team support this idea. Specifically, volunteers are being recruited to log online monthly pollution and wildlife biodiversity related information at part of a Thornbury stream that they frequently visit and cherish; or

possibly an area that they are concerned about. This can be done e.g. while walking the dog. There will be no need to enter the water or take water samples.

BART will shortly (September /October) commence training individuals. The training is mostly online covering biodiversity, pollution, health and safety. Once set up there will also be the facility to network with other Water Guardians in Thornbury.

Peter's Declaration about Jesus

¹³ Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' ¹⁴ And they said, 'Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' ¹⁵ He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' ¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, ^[a] the Son of the living God.' ¹⁷ And Jesus answered him, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. ¹⁸ And I tell you, you are Peter, ^[b] and on this rock ^[c] I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. ¹⁹ I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.' ²⁰ Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was ^[d] the Messiah. ^[e]
